<u>PERMITTEE INFORMATION</u> The information in this block is the permit tee's address of residence, an agency's mailing address, or may be a company's mailing address.

BURN SITE LOCATION In rural areas, always fill in the section, township, range, forty, county, and fire number.

BURNING PERMIT CONDITIONS

Piled Material - Circle the fire or list other fuel such as farm crop residue, potato vines, ect. Also identify the number of piles and size of the piles: (example) # Piles – 6; Approx. size – 10' diameter. If the piles are windrows; (example) # Piles – 6 windrows; Approx. size – 10 acres.

Running Fire — This is listed separately since a running fire may create control problems. Running fires are often special permits requiring local forester approval. Follow your local procedures. Size of area must be in acres.

FIRE SAFETY AND AIR QUALITY REQUIRMENTS

AS HOLDER OF A PERMIT I AGREE:

- To keep this fire under control and to assume responsibility for all damages and costs that may result from the burning done under this permit.
- To attend this fire until completely extinguished.
- To have this permit available at the burn site for inspection.
- Not to burn is there is a practical alternative method for disposal of the material such as chipping or composting.
- To use a clean burning device to start the fire.
- Not to conduct burning during any air quality alerts.
- Not to burn paper or cardboard except as provided under Minnesota Statutes 17.135.
- To extinguish the fire immediately if the permit is revoked.
- That prevailing winds must be away from nearby occupies buildings.
- That the fire will not be allowed to smolder without flame.

PROHIBITED MATERIALS ARE: oils, rubber, plastics, tires and chemically treated materials such as railroad ties, treated lumber, composite shingles, tar paper, insulation, composition board, sheet rock, wiring, paint, hazardous and industrial waste.

VIOLATIONS of the permit conditions may subject permit tee to criminal and / or civil actions

RECYCLE, REUSE, AND COMPOST

- 1. A state permit is required statewide unless the ground is snow covered.
- 2. If a local ordinance is in force, issue the permit but instruct / refer the permit tee to obtain a local permit.
- When no state permit is required, open burning is still restrictive to vegetative, non-polluting materials which cannot be practically composed or chipped.
- 4. A state permit must be obtained from a DNR Forestry Office for permanent tree and brush sights, and training of firefighters.

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU BURN

- 1. To burn you must first have a burning permit.
- 2. Before Burning Call Regional Dispatch at 701-451-7660 and Sabin-Elmwood Fire at 701-361-7575 give them your name, address and burning permit number. New 2013

FAIRURE TO DO THE ABOVE COULD RESULT IN A FIRE CALL THAT COULD COST YOU \$300 OR MORE.

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED MATERIALS (I.E., CANNOT BE BURNED)

- 1. Tires, rubber or rubber products
- 2. Chemically treated lumber
- 3. Railroad ties, telephone poles
- 4. Plastic pesticide or herbicide containers
- 5. Plastic liners in seed, feed, or pesticide bags
- 6. Plastic containers such as milk, motor oil, household, or other plastic containers
- 7. Tar paper, shingles, or other asphalt materials
- 8. Insulation
- 9. Composition board or sheet rock
- 10. Wiring, insulation on wiring or cable
- 11. Hazardous waste (including household hazardous waste)
- 12. Commercial or institutional structures
- 13. Paint or paint filters
- 14. Used motor oil or other petroleum-based products
- 15. Vehicles, motors or parts of vehicles, or motors
- 16. Animal compost
